Who we are

NMBI is the regulator for the professions of nursing and midwifery in Ireland. We have a statutory obligation to protect the public and the integrity of the practice of the professions of nursing and midwifery. We perform our functions in the public interest under the Nurses Act, 1985 and the Nurses and Midwives Act 2011, as amended.

Our vision

Our vision is to provide leadership to registered nurses and midwives to deliver safe care through innovative and proactive professional regulation.

Our mission

Our mission is to protect the public and the integrity of the professions of nursing and midwifery through the promotion of high standards of education, training and professional conduct.

What we do

In our role as the regulator for the professions of nursing and midwifery and in fulfilling our mission we:

- maintain the [Register of Nurses and Midwives](#) and a Candidate Register for student nurses and student midwives
- set the [standards](#) for the education and training of nurses and midwives
- approve programmes of education necessary for registration and monitor these programmes on an ongoing basis
- support our registrants by providing appropriate guidance on professional conduct and ethics for both registered nurses and midwives
- inquire into [complaints](#) about our registrants. We make decisions relating to the imposition of sanctions on registered nurses and midwives who have findings made against them, and
- advise the Minister and the public on all matters of relevance relating to our functions.

Our role in setting standards and providing guidance for more than 81,000 registered nurses and midwives in Ireland focuses on public safety. We work collaboratively with the Department of Health, employers, managers, unions, educators, other regulatory bodies and our registrants.

Introduction to State of the Register 2022

Protecting patients and other members of the public is at the heart of what we do at the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI). We are committed to fulfilling this objective by supporting registered nurses and midwives to provide patient care to the highest standards.

We know that nurses and midwives often work in challenging settings and we also know that they practise with courtesy, compassion and empathy. At NMBI, we see our role as helping nurses and midwives make the right decisions for patients and supporting them in their efforts to achieve the highest standards of professional practice.

As an organisation mandated with regulating nurses and midwives, NMBI works to ensure that we operate in line with best practice in all areas of our work. NMBI welcomes opportunities to hear from nurses, midwives, the public and others on any aspect of our work.

NMBI State of the Register 2022

NMBI is proud to publish the *NMBI State of the Register 2022*. Our Register tells us how many nurses and midwives are registered, practising and patient-facing in Ireland.

This publication is possible following the digitisation of our annual renewal process and the valuable data provided by registrants.

The data for this report was compiled on the 1 June 2022 and covers the 12-month period from 1 June 2021 to 31 May 2022. This data will be published annually from this year on. June is chosen as the data collection point as it is the most stable point of the year for the Register.

It is important to note that during the annual renewal cycle, nurses and midwives self-identify if they are practising or patient-facing, so the data provided is self-declared.

The numbers

The number of nurses and midwives registered with the NMBI on the 1 June 2022 was **81,431**. This is the largest number of registrants ever held by NMBI.

Of these, **75,871** state that they are currently practising and **66,471** state they are patient-facing in their practice.

We can see that the number of practising nurses and midwives has increased in every division. This is driven by the increase in undergraduate numbers and ongoing overseas recruitment of nurses and midwives to work in Ireland. There has been a gradual increase in the number of undergraduate places available and over the coming years we will see the steady increase in Irish educated nurses and midwives join the Register.

Nurses and midwives that were educated outside of Ireland are very welcome and make vital contributions to the Irish health and social care systems.

Each registrant making up this data is an educated and dedicated professional that works hard to deliver high-quality, safe care. It is important to note that the numbers here do not exactly reflect the 'workforce' as many registrants may have roles in teaching, in research or other areas where their professional skills are needed.


As part of the annual renewal process, registrants are required to self-declare information. This includes providing their workplace details, if they are currently practising in a division of the Register and if they are patient-facing. As a result, there may be minor discrepancies in some of this data.

For the purpose of this publication, some assumptions were made about the data available. The primary assumption was that nurses and midwives that joined the Register in the last twelve months did so to practice, therefore, where possible, this has been incorporated into the 'practising' data presented throughout. This assumption does not undermine or distort the data, it is a reasonable assumption and was made to make the data more relatable, understandable and applicable to the current workforce.

This report also provides other relevant data to note for 2021. These statistics are set out in the Appendix section.

Use of the Register data

We hope that the valuable data within this report can be used for information, research and evidence-based workforce planning across the Irish healthcare system to health care planners, policy makers and providers make informed decisions benefiting the public and the professions.

Figure 1 Age distribution of all registrants






Figure 3 Nationality of all registrants

Figure 4 Number of new first time registrations








Figure 6 Age distribution of General Nurses division






Figure 7 Geographical distribution in Ireland of practising General Nurses

Figure 8 Age distribution of Children’s Nurses division






Figure 9 Geographical distribution in Ireland of practising Children's Nurses




Figure 10 Age distribution of Psychiatric Nurses division






Figure 11 Geographical distribution in Ireland of practising Psychiatric Nurses

Figure 12 Age distribution of Intellectual Disability Nurses division





Figure 13 Geographical distribution in Ireland of Intellectual Disability Nurses

Figure 14 Age distribution of Midwives division






Figure 15 Geographical distribution in Ireland of Midwives

Figure 16 Age distribution of Public Health Nurses division





Figure 17 Geographical distribution in Ireland of Public Health Nurses

Figure 18 Age distribution of Advanced Nurse Practitioners division






Figure 19 Geographical distribution in Ireland of Advanced Nurse Practitioners

Figure 20 Age distribution of Nurse Prescribers division






Figure 21 Geographical distribution in Ireland of Nurse Prescribers

Figure 22 Age distribution of Nurse Tutors division





Figure 23 Geographical distribution in Ireland of practising Nurse Tutors

Figure 24 Age distribution of Advanced Midwife Practitioners, Midwife Prescribers and Midwife Tutors divisions






Figure 25 Geographical distribution in Ireland of practising Advanced Midwife Practitioners, Midwife Prescribers and Midwife Tutors





Certificates of Current Professional Status (CCPS)

NMBI issues Certificates of Current Professional Status (CCPSs) for nurses and midwives who may wish to register abroad. CCPSs are sent directly from NMBI to the equivalent regulatory authority in the country or state where the nurse or midwife is seeking registration. A nurse or midwife may request more than one CCPS in any one year. We issue a separate CCPS for each division of the Register.

Figure B Total number of individual CCPS requests by individuals January-December 2021 and January-June 2022



Figure C CCPS applications January to December 2021 – based on country of birth of applicant, countries (with more than five applications)




Figure D CCPS applications January to June 2022 – based on country of birth of applicant (countries with more than five applications)



Figure E Number of overseas applications




Figure F Age distribution of overseas applicants



